The Subject

The discussion on contemporary climate change in its anthropogenic nature, extent, temporal limits, and impact on different biological communities on our planet is, undoubtedly, one of the topics that has dominated the international public agenda, scientific writing, and everyday discussion in our countries of the Global South.

Our discipline has not been absent from this discussion. Archaeology helps us understaning how human groups have interrelated and approached other animal communities during different moments of environmental change throughout the occupation of the neotropics.

It is in this sense that zooarchaeology allows an approach of special relevance in the understanding of the mechanisms and strategies that our species has developed to confront environmental changes.

Under this premise, we make this first call for papers for the V Meeting of the Neotropical Zooarchaeology Working Group of the International Council for Archaeozoology, to be held in Santiago, Chile, between November 18th and 20th, 2024.

Guidelines for communication submission

Contributions can include original research, reevaluation or interpretations of previous data, development of research strategies to be shared with the zooarchaeological community, among other topics.

Presentations in both oral and poster formats will be accepted. If necessary, to adjust time or space, some proposed abstracts for oral presentations may be suggested as posters.

The deadline for abstract submission is April 30th, 2024.


Guidelines for communication submission

Oral and poster communications, as well as their respective abstracts, can be presented in Spanish, Portuguese or English.

Abstracts should have a maximum length of 500 words, including references (if applicable). The abstract should not contain tables or figures.
